Pastoral Half Term Highlights for Year 7-11 for Half Term 1 2024-25

We have had a packed first half term and are delighted to share with you an overview of some of the exciting events that have happened over the last six weeks from a Pastoral perspective; we are very proud of how hard our students have worked so far this academic year. We have also added a few key reminders.

As you can see, a lot of amazing things have or are about to take place - you may wish to get comfy with a warming drink before reading! We will share our pastoral update with you each half term.

Assemblies

Over the last half term the students have experienced a wide variety of topics through our academy assemblies. Firstly, their behaviour and conduct during these important sessions has been wonderful, particularly when we have had the pleasure of external speakers and presenters. We hold our collective reflection at the end of every tutor time and assembly, where we pause for one minute to consider the thought for the day.

Mrs Kell began our series of assemblies with a 'welcome' and a theme of perception, focussing on how we are as well as how we wish to be perceived by others. This was followed with assemblies by senior leaders and the Pastoral teams, exploring respect as well as celebrating the great start to the year so far. The importance of Black History Month was shared with students, as well as specific assemblies for Year 11 on the importance of their final year at the academy and the launch of the Prom Passport.

During Well-Being Week, we had the pleasure of hosting Head Start, who spoke to students regarding the importance of mental health - signposting them to where they can get help if they need it and offering them the opportunity to participate in workshops as a Head Start Leader. In addition to this, KS4 students were given information about their upcoming work experience placements (Year 10) and future career paths including our Sixth Form Open Evening (Year 10 and 11).

Finally, Year 13 Senior Student Leaders, Miss Dixon and I delivered assemblies celebrating our student leadership body, sharing details of our new Student Leadership programme. Students in Year 9 have been given the opportunity to apply for the new role of Student Leader. Applications for this can be submitted in any form or creative way including: a piece of art, a vlog, blog, written letter, presentation, dance, piece of drama, a poem, collage etc. The remit is simple: what makes you a suitable candidate for this role and what do you want to give back to our school community. Students in Year 10 are eligible to apply for the position of Prefect and students in Year 11 for the post of Senior Prefect. Students who wish to apply for these posts must do so in writing but with the same criteria. All applications should be submitted to their Senior Pastoral Manager, Miss Dixon or I by Friday 8 November. It will be fantastic to see so many students being given roles of authority and responsibility within the academy!



Tutor time

This half term has had a focus of resilience, and students have been contributing to different tasks and activities based around this quality. There have been sessions on resilience at the recent Olympics, Paralympics over time, students competing in card challenges that tested their patience, teamwork and resilience skills, as well as learning about Black History Month, Literacy and Numeracy activities, RE and world faiths, Mental Health and Well Being, and current world news and cultural events. Within all tutor time sessions, it has been great to see discussions around Social, Moral, Cultural and Spiritual links to society and topics, as well as students developing a deeper understanding of diversity and British Values. Next half term's focus will be respect, with students continuing to understand and appreciate those around them.



After the holidays we will be celebrating and respecting Remembrance Day. During tutor sessions, we will be exploring how we all have links to World War One, World War Two and subsequent conflicts - it would be wonderful if you could have discussions at home before these sessions so that students realise the possible connections they have to Remembrance Day.

Students have made a fantastic start to the new academic year with a huge 488739 achievement points that have been awarded to our amazing students, which is 345 on average per student. 70% of our school community have received little to no behaviour points which



demonstrates that they have been fully equipped and being the best they can be in all lessons - which is a great achievement. Well done to those students.

Uniform and standards

Our school uniform promotes equality and inclusivity by removing the differences in dress that may exist between students from different economic backgrounds. One of the main reasons why schools implement uniforms is to maintain good discipline. When everyone is wearing the same clothing, it eliminates the pressure on students to wear expensive or trendy clothing to fit in with their peers and reduces the chances of clothing-related conflicts or unnecessary absence from school from the fear of not fitting in. We are proud that our uniform promotes a sense of community, as everyone is part of the same team. It also ensures a suitable dress code is maintained which promotes a professional learning environment which is suitable for all of the activities students are required to do in lessons. To support safeguarding, our uniform also makes it easy for staff members to identify students. This is particularly important in a large school such as ours. It also reduces the risk of outsiders entering the school and posing as students, which could be a significant security risk.

Studies have also shown that school uniforms lead to improved academic performance, helping students focus on their studies without distraction. It also improves their sense of belonging and creates a more positive school environment.

The cost of our school uniform has been significantly reduced to ensure the minimum branded items need to be purchased to support the rationale for our uniform without being an overburdening cost to you, our parents/carers.

Over the half term break, we politely request that you ensure your child's uniform meets our expectations in time for their return. In particular, students should remove false eyelashes or false nails. Sensible plain black school shoes must be worn at all times and if your child



chooses to wear a skirt, the length should be worn to the knee and not be made from an elasticated material.

Additionally, all students should be fully equipped for learning with their planner and a fully equipped pencil case (Black pen, green pen, pencil, eraser, pencil sharpener, calculator, highlighters/pencil crayons).

Attendance and punctuality

Students need to be attending the academy to ensure they are not missing any learning. The Department for Education expected that children should attend school regularly - which means maintaining a 96% attendance record. There is a direct correlation between academic achievement and maintaining positive attendance. The link attached is for our attendance pamphlet which gives you helpful advice and guidance around how to maintain positive attendance and for what to do when/if your child is too poorly to attend school. 741 students are currently meeting the 96% target with 441 students with 100% attendance. Amazing and well done to those students.

Punctuality to the academy is also important and is an essential life skill. The first curriculum lesson starts at 8.30am. Students need to be onsite with the gates closing at 8.25am. This allows time for the student to get to their lesson on time to be greeted by their teacher. It is pleasing to see that the vast majority of our students arrive at school well within the expected time.

Middlesbrough Football Club

This academic year we have engaged support from Middlesbrough Football Club, who are delivering interventions to groups of students. These interventions are on health and wellbeing, risky behaviour and personal safety, achieving a social action project award, careers and employability skills and premier league leadership programme. Students have been selected to be involved for a 10 week programme.

Throughout this half term students have also had the opportunity to win game tickets and stadium visits. Well done to those who have been awarded tickets, keep up the good work!

Year 11 LIFE lessons

Redcar & Cleveland Borough Council's Substance Misuse Prevention team visited school over a two week period to work with our Year 11 students in LIFE lessons around making positive choices in their lives. The team were delighted with the way in which our Year 11 students engaged and responded. Miss Wilcockson, Substance Misuse Prevention Coordinator said: 'After being in Nunthorpe for two weeks, all we can say is how great every student was. All were really respectful and got involved in our sessions. Nunthorpe, we hope



you're as proud of your students as we are and we can't wait to come back and see years 7,8 and 9.' We look forward to welcoming the team back soon.



Headstart

Karen, Julie and John from Headstart joined us in Year 7, Year 8, Year 9 and Year 10 assemblies to introduce us to their Headstart programme. Many of our students knew the team from primary school opportunities. They discussed the Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards, which will see students training in mental health and developing and leading initiatives within the academy, culminating in a Summer Workshop, joining students from other schools at Teesside University or the Riverside Stadium. Student Leadership

It's been a very busy but very exciting time for our student leaders! School Council has continued to grow; over 50 different students have attended meetings this half term. They have been involved in helping to shape the new student leadership structure outlined below, and, together with our anti-bullying group, have helped to review, adapt and add to our anti-bullying policy and procedures.

Christmas Hamper Campaign and Middlesbrough Food Bank collection

School Council are currently in the process of planning our contributions to the CAUSE Christmas Hamper Campaign, where we will be asking for your help to put together hampers for 12 local families who would otherwise struggle to provide Christmas for their children. We will be asking for donations of food (tins/ packets/ jars etc), Christmas dinner and treats (tinned veg and potatoes/ instant mash, gravy, stuffing, desserts, chocolate), gifts for children aged 1-16 and adults. Once we have finalised the lists of required items, we will share this via Class Charts and in form time with students. In addition to this, we will also be collecting for Middlesbrough Food Bank in the two weeks leading up to Christmas.

Anti-bullying Policy and Update

Throughout this half term, the anti-bullying group and School Council have been working hard to edit and update our anti-bullying policy, including contributing to the development of a new flowchart which outlines clearly what will happen when any allegations of bullying are received. Students will join Miss Dixon and I at the next governor meeting next half term to present our new policy for ratification. The next project for the anti-bullying group will be planning activities and creating an assembly for anti-bullying week in November. We will also be looking for opportunities for more students to be trained as anti-bullying ambassadors and working increasingly closely with our sixth form Peer Mentors to ensure the appropriate support is offered to anyone who needs it.

New Student Leadership Structure

As mentioned above, all year groups have been hearing in assemblies last week from Mrs Darbyshire, Miss Dixon and the Year 13 Senior Student Leaders about the new student leadership structure. In addition to the opportunities outlined above, students in Year 7 have been given the opportunity to become a Sports Leader and students in Year 12 and 13 will start our new buddying system next half term.

Year 7

We are delighted with the way our Year 7 students have settled into Nunthorpe Academy. The first half term has seen lots of exciting and positive news to share.

Year 7 are leading the way with achievement points across the academy. We have achieved over 100,000 points since starting in September. Over 38,000 are for being equipped and working well and over 26,000 for excellent effort. Current attendance for Year 7 is almost 95%. Attendance matters, therefore please continue to encourage students to attend the academy everyday to be recognised as a Year 7 HERO and rewarded. These are fantastic achievements and we are very proud of Year 7.

We have representation from Year 7 within the Student Council, Anti-Bullying Ambassadors and Peer Mentors. We have also just launched our student leadership initiative and are looking for representation from Year 7, this will be taking place over the coming weeks. We were also proud to see so many Year 7 students wearing something yellow on World Mental Health Day 2024. Following an assembly from Head Start, some of our Year 7 students have volunteered to be involved in the Head Start programme which is an introduction to mental health, wellbeing and resilience. These students will engage in an accredited pathway of education towards their bronze award over the coming year.

Many of our Year 7 students have engaged with acts of kindness, resilience and helping others, demonstrating ready, respectful and safe on a daily basis. Each week our top 10 students from Year 7 are rewarded with prizes, lunch queue jumpers, extra achievement points or recognition for their ongoing contribution to outstanding behaviour, attitude and learning. Year 7 students have also been recognised and rewarded with 'hot chocolate' with the Head of school.

We had almost 90 students attend the football trials and our PE department had to do a further trial to select the squads for this year. We are proud to announce Year 7 now has an A and B



team representing Nunthorpe Academy. We hope to share some sporting achievements over the coming year.

In partnership with our Music Department, we are hosting auditions for the Nunthorpe Academy Talent Show on Wednesday 23rd October. The Auditions are open to singers, dancers, musicians, magicians, gymnasts, comedians etc.. The talent show will take place next half term and there are prizes to be won. We are hoping to have representation from year 7 students, showcasing some amazing talents.

The vast majority of Year 7 students are equipped every day, having a reading book, fully loaded pencil case, calculator and planner. We would however like to encourage our students to vary the books they read, utilising the school library with recommendations from friends and family. Some of our Year 7 students are still showing the same reading book from the beginning of term. Please can we ask for support in encouraging year 7 students to pick up a book and to read daily.

Some Year 7 students are still finding their feet when it comes to our expectations, especially around social time behaviour, punctuality and some behaviour within lessons. Additionally, please can you continue to encourage students to complete homework as set out on Class Charts - we will continue to insist on our high expectations of all students and continue to monitor this.

We are exceptionally proud of what Year 7 has achieved in the first half term and we look forward to another amazing half term!

Literacy

This half-term in Years 7-9 (Key Stage 3), we've focused on igniting a love for reading through an exciting selection of literature. Students have been exploring the world of science fiction and have been focusing on texts such as 'Jurassic Park', 'Planet of the Apes' and 'The War of the Worlds'. These diverse texts have been designed to engage all students, encouraging even the most reluctant readers to develop a stronger connection to reading.

In Years 10 and 11 (Key Stage 4), we've been focussing on core curriculum literacy skills. This term, we've worked on building students' subject-specific vocabulary and strengthening their comprehension of more complex material. By focusing on literacy in these key areas, students have been developing the skills to communicate their knowledge more clearly, both in their current lessons and in preparation for their GCSEs.

Furthermore, as part of our commitment to fostering a love for reading, all Year 7 students have been gifted a free book through the Book Buzz programme. This fantastic initiative, run by the Book Trust, allows students to choose from a diverse selection of engaging titles. It's a wonderful way to encourage independent reading, and the excitement from students as they selected their books was truly heart warming. We hope these books inspire a lifelong passion for reading!









Toilet Breaks

One of the main areas of the school that we have to manage effectively is the toilets. As our building is old, we ensure that our toilets are clean and safe, our extended site team supporting us with this through the checking and cleaning of facilities between social times; from the weeks either side of the half term, we will be closely monitoring the use of toilets during learning time and employing a queuing system supported by a gate to keep our facilities in tip top condition.
