Pastoral Update - Half term 3 2024-25

Dear Parent(s) / Carer(s) It feels like this half term has flown by! The last seven weeks have been

packed full of sporting

accolades, rehearsals for the school production, school trips, rewards draws, a very busy pastoral programme and the second set of mock exams for Year 11 and Year 13. Just half term two, we have lots of exciting news and information to share with you. As we go into February half term break, please take a moment to read through the exciting opportunities that our students have participated in at Nunthorpe and the commitment to being the best that we can be.

Assemblies and Tutor Time Activities

The assemblies this half term have been poignant and varied, marking a plethora of key dates on the worldly calendar. Kicking off this half term with a bang, Trust Vice Principal Mrs Darbyshire, delivered assemblies from Year 7 to Year 13 on the importance of time management, reflection and setting achievable goals; all the more important given that GCSE examination are just ten weeks away with A Levels starting a few weeks after. Additionally, Mr Yale and Ms Hewison delivered a session on 'World Religion Day' a global celebration of faith and unity of beliefs. Our students were superb; confidently and articulately naming three, four and sometimes five religious followings in each assembly, exceptional work. Further poignant assemblies have also been delivered to our students, namely a remembrance session for the atrocities of the Holocaust. Delivered by Ms Hewison and Mrs Darbyshire, the message was curated to ensure that such events do not go unnoticed as time goes by; highlighting the importance of standing up for what is right and doing good by those who need help the most. Other assemblies this half term have included safeguarding updates, based on how to keep yourself and friends safe in the local area, delivered by our AVP SENDCO Mrs Brosnan, with our traditional Celebration and Rewards assembly concluding the first half term. It has been busy to say the least.

In tutor sessions, students have experienced a number of sessions based on several important aspects of life and culture. Of late, students have experienced celebrations in the Lunar New Year, understanding the symbolism behind key traditions experienced by members of Eastern culture, alongside educational sessions based on healthy living and lifestyle. Further celebrations have taken place in tutor time surrounding communal, group based activities; all tutor groups in the main school having the chance to compete in a Valentines inspired guiz. Results will be counted and verified before being announced on the first week back after the half term break. Good luck to all!

Well-being activities

Sixth formers have participated in copious wellbeing activities including dodgeball, crafts, game shows and table tennis to name a few. Students have all been involved and are thoroughly





enjoying their chosen activities! We have recently offered them a new option but they are all happy with those chosen in September. We love that they are not only gaining team building skills but are meeting new friends and engaging with those outside of their social circle.



In Years 7-11, students have been involved in reading for pleasure, participating in guizzes. We have also been reflecting upon the theme of kindness throughout tutor time. During assemblies, we remembered events of the Holocaust, marking the eightieth anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz- Birkenau, and we considered how our actions can have an impact on those around us. Hot Chocolate with the Head has been very well attended- demonstrating the outstanding positive attitudes of our students! You can view this by clicking on this link. Attendance Raising attendance continues to be a national focus for the Department for Education. As a trust, and at our school, we follow and promote all the national statutory requirements and guidance. All students should aim to have at least 96% attendance. Maintaining positive attendance enables students to fulfil their potential academically and are statistically more likely to be happy and become involved in the wider life of the school. Whilst we appreciate that anyone can occasionally be too poorly to attend, it is essential that students maximise time in school. Please support us in encouraging your child to attend school every day, to be on time and to be fully prepared with everything they need for the day in their bag. We keep students updated of their attendance each Monday along with our standards checks.







If your child is absent from school, please contact school on the first day of absence and every day afterwards until they return. We hope that you have seen our new weekly updates on our social media channels celebrating our 'In it to Win it' draws where students who have either 100% or 96% attendance for the year and those with 100% for the week are entered into prize draws.





Behaviour Since September, we have had a huge focus on promoting our core value of Respect, in particular, rewarding all our students for fulfilling our expectations and for going above and beyond. We are delighted that the total amount of ambition points our students have achieved is a whopping 1387,771! In the last week of this half term, all students have participated in rewards assemblies and students who receive zero behaviour points are all placed into rewards draws each week with students receiving vouchers for their efforts.

SMSC

Our Headstarters programme is now into its sixth session and our students are gaining so much knowledge and understanding around wellbeing and mental health of young people. The coordinator from 'Headstart- South Tees' is full of praise for our students and is very impressed with how they are responding to the sessions.

Our Headstarters group have also been invited to attend 'Morning with the Mayor' in Redcar next month, where they will have the opportunity to speak to decision-makers about what is important to students from our Academy. They will be speaking to other students to gain their ideas and opinions in order to represent the whole academy community at this event.

Enrichment

Opportunities to broaden your interests and take part in activities that you might not usually have the chance to do in day to day school life are continuing to be popular within the academy. Sporting Round-Up Basketball

The year 7 team have gone unbeaten and are awaiting the news of their opponents in the knockout rounds of the North region. The year 8 team were played in a tough group against two of the best teams in the North East, therefore finishing a brilliant 3rd in their group. Cross Country


